These milestones will be incorporated into the teachings and programs so that they become bench marks on the faith journey of our children and youth. We hope you will also take the time to support these goals throughout the learning process at home. Christian Milestones

Preschool age children:

- Know that God is Love and that Jesus loves them.
- Learn the song Jesus Loves Me.
- The Bible is a special book about God and Jesus.

Kindergarten:

- Jesus' two greatest commandments (Mark 12:28-32)
- Seasons of the Liturgical Year

First Grade:

- The Doxology as praise to God.
- Symbols of our faith and the symbol of the Presbyterian Church (USA)

Second Grade:

- Knowledge of the sacraments of Baptism and Communion.
- To know that Baptism is a sign of belonging and Communion a time of remembrance.
- The Lord's Prayer as the prayer Jesus taught us to say.

Third Grade:

- The Twenty Third Psalm – God the protector and the one who watches and cares for each of us
- Books of the Bible and how the Bible is organized

Fourth Grade:

- Beatitudes
- The Ten Commandments as a guide for living

Fifth Grade:

- Know that church began at Pentecost and the story can be found in Acts
- Who was Paul? Letters from Paul?

Grades 6-7:

- Jesus' Ministry from baptism through resurrection
- Early church/gospels/book of Acts – seeing the Bible as a guide for life.
- Reformation, Church History and the primary tenets of the Reformed faith.
- The Apostle's Creed as a statement of what we believe.

Grades 8-9:

- Confirmation Class – personal statement of faith
