



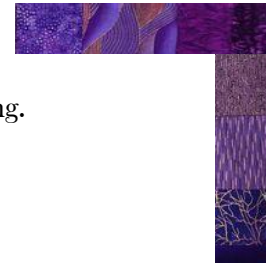
Six Weeks & Six Words

Adult Education

Sundays at 9:15 a.m. | Library & on Zoom

Join the Adult Education class as we look at **Hope in the Uncovering of Biblical Violence**. **Dr. Denise Dombrowski Hopkins**, the award-winning Woodrow W. & Mildred B. Miller Professor of Biblical Theology at Wesley Seminary, will challenge us to delve into Biblical messages about violence on March 5, 12, and 19, during this year's Lenten journey.

March 5 | *Not So Fast: Linger at the Cross in Mark's Gospel* - In this session we are reminded that Good Friday darkness precedes the hope of Easter. We will look at the original ending of the Gospel of Mark in conjunction with paintings by Holocaust (Shoah) survivor Samuel Bak that are meant to remember, mourn, and provisionally repair the trauma of the Shoah. We are challenged to take up our own repair work in today's traumatized world. In this call and response to repair work rests our hope.

March 12 | *The Little Enslaved Girl in 2 Kings 5: Heroine or Victim?* - Sometimes we gloss over violence that is not obvious in biblical texts. In our passive reading we become complicit in the text's violence. The little girl taken captive in war in 2 Kings chapter 5 is held up as a model of faith by most interpreters, who ignore the unspoken trauma of her life. We must recognize her trauma and look for ways in which we take violence as normal today. In this dual recognition rests our hope.

March 19 | *Reading Literally, Reading Dangerously: The Marriage Metaphor in Hosea 1-3* - In Hosea 1-3 the prophet uses the metaphor of marriage to deliver a message of judgment against the northern kingdom of Israel in the 8th century BCE. When we read the metaphor literally, Hosea represents God and Gomer (Hosea's wife) represents sinful Israel, we engage in an act of interpretive violence that can give divine warrant to domestic abuse. If we investigate the cultural and economic/political context of Hosea, a different reading is possible. In this investigation rests our hope.

Witnessing Our Stewardship: Achieving the Church's Strategic Goals

Thank you to everyone who pledged during our most recent stewardship campaign. Despite the success of that campaign, session still had to make difficult choices when allocating the church's anticipated resources to accomplish its 2023 strategic objectives of:

- Preparing for the recommendations of the Strategic Visioning Task Force for the church's future when they are available later this Spring.
- Improving our technology and connectional ministries to make it easier for members to participate in church activities remotely and to help members reconnect after COVID-19.
- Increasing our capital reserves for necessary maintenance and for future maintenance of our building and grounds.
- Keeping the church strong through key staff transitions.

The church is expected to have a budget deficit in 2023. It was also projected to have had an operating deficit in 2022, but unpledged year-end gifts transformed that shortfall into a modest surplus. That demonstrated once again that it is the continued generosity of its members that will enable Bradley Hills to become the church that God is calling it to be. Back By Popular Demand: Authors Among Us Panel Discussion

Tuesday, March 14 at 7:30 p.m. | On Zoom

The Authors Among Us third panel discussion will offer a wide variety of topics, including historical fiction, poetry, science, children's literature, contemporary social critique, legal advocacy, religious analysis, and female body image. Book lovers and interested parties welcome!

This panel will showcase 6 authors: two from BHPC, two from Bethesda Jewish Congregation (BJC), and two from the Maqaame Ibrahim Islamic Center (MIIC). This event is sponsored by the Inter-Congregational Partnership Committee (ICPC).

Nancy Allinson, a member of BJC, is a Maryland poet and winner of the *Bethesda 8 Trolley Poetry Bench* competition. As a result, you can see her poems written on benches in Bethesda. Her work has appeared in *Poet Lore*, *The Federal Poet*, *Minimus*, *Winners - A Retrospective of the Washington Prize*, *The Word Works*, and other literary publications. Nancy's most recent book of poems, *Under the Catalpa Tree*, was published in 2021. She has also written two other books. Nancy is retired from the Federal service, where she worked of the Environmental Protection Agency, the U.S. Coast Guard (civilian), and the National Science Foundation.

Dil Banu, an affiliate of the MIIC, is a Muslim by birth and practice, and is a retired lecturer from a prestigious school in her homeland of Bangladesh. She settled in the U.S. about twenty-six years ago and worked as a substitute teacher in local elementary schools for a year before operating a licensed family daycare in her apartment where all of her neighbors were Christians. This job was a turning point in her life that led to her interest in writing. She published the book, *One God for All*. The book is an interesting and contemplative work that delves deep into the ancient texts of both the Bible and the Quran to uncover the ties which bind Judaism, Christianity, and Islam to each other and the origins from which differing practices and beliefs have stemmed. People of all religious backgrounds would find this text thorough and informative.

Rabia Chaudry, an affiliate of the MIIC, is an attorney, advocate, and author of the New York Times best-selling book *Adnan's Story*, and Executive Producer of a four-part HBO documentary series, *The Case Against Adnan Syed*. Rabia is also co-producer and co-host of the podcasts: *The 45th*, *The Hidden Djinn*, *Nighty Night*, and *Undisclosed*. Recently, she wrote *Fatty Fatty Boom Boom: A Memoir of Food, Fat, and Family*. It is a warm, intimate memoir about food, body image, and growing up in a loving, but sometimes oppressively concerned Pakistani immigrant family. The memoir offers readers a relatable and powerful voice on the controversial topic of body image.

Michael Gibson, a member of BHPC, serves as an Administrative Judge with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission during the day. He devotes his nights and weekends researching and writing. Michael is the author of a contemporary social critique called, *Can We Stop the Radical Religious Right?* In addition, he has written two historical fiction novels, *The Broomcorn Field: The Odyssey of an Army Ranger in World War II* and *Leaving Pontotoc County: The Odyssey of Two Young Women in World War II*. Both books address the unexpected issues facing people at that time.

Clinton Kelly, a member of BHPC, has a career in government and industry primarily focused on computer science and robotics. In 1984, at the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA), Clint was a key player in developing an autonomous land vehicle project—technology used in today's driverless cars. In their personal life, Clint and his wife, Missy, photographed wildlife on every continent and in the High Arctic, including eight years of photographing all 21 species of penguins known in the world. The results are captured in their book, *In Pursuit of all the World's Penguins*. Most recently, Clint became the 629th person to enter space since 1961. This adventure will be described in his next book, *Commentaries on 50 Years of Travel*.

Karen Levy, a member of BJC, has worked as a program planner for an international arts organization, a volunteer firefighter, and has been a teacher in the Washington D.C. area for over 30 years. Karen has written a children's book titled, *Lulu Lamby*. It is about a child's journeys with his stuffed animal, a baby lamb.
