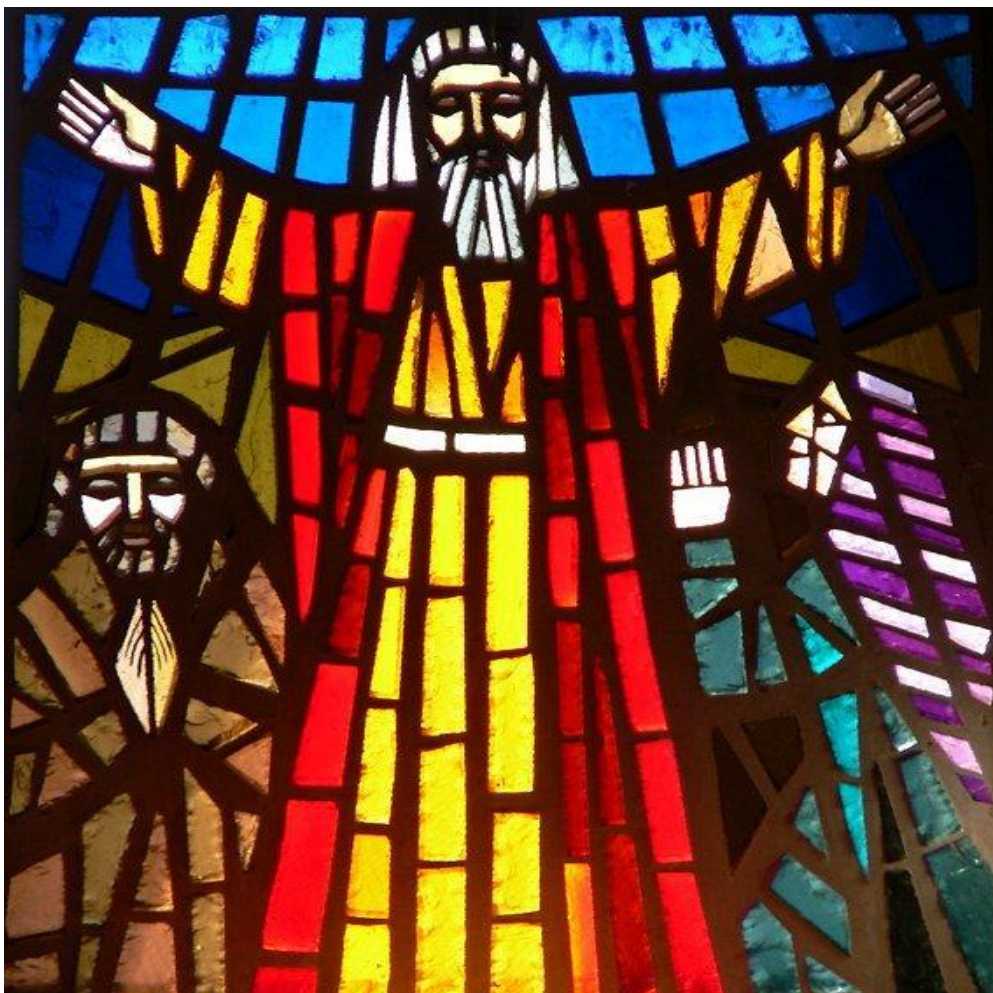

Olive Oil Ministry

The Olive Oil Ministry (OOM) is a project which supports the Palestinian agriculture sector, promotes peace and justice, and raises awareness of the struggles in Gaza and the West Bank. The olive oil we sell is produced from olives grown by farmers in the West Bank and the earnings from sales go for medical supplies and services in Gaza. Many products qualify are organic and/or fair-trade.



Starting on November 24, sales will be in Covenant Hall after the 10:30 service and continue weekly until all products are sold.

This year we are selling three types of olive oil: olive oil soap, za'atar spice packets, and jars of olive or tomato tapenade.

Harold Friedell (May 11, 1905, Jamaica, Queens, NY - February 17, 1958, Hasting - On -Hudson, NY) was an American organist, choirmaster, teacher, and composer. At an early age, he served as organist at First Methodist Episcopal Church (Jamaica, Queens) and studied organ with Clement Gale and David McK. Williams. He later served as organist at Calvary Church (New York), organist and choirmaster at Saint John's Church (Jersey City, N.J.), organist and choirmaster at Calvary Church (New York), and finally organist and master of the choir at Saint Bartholomew's Church (New York). Friedell also taught on the faculty of the Union Theological Seminary School of Sacred Music (New York).

As a composer, Friedell composed works for organ, orchestra, and choir, as well as hymn tunes, descants, and music for solo voice. His Anthem, *King of Glory*, sets the well-loved text by George Herbert in a plain yet powerful manner.
