

A Music Note | *Behold, the tabernacle of God* is a well-loved staple of the choral repertoire, with a reputation well-deserved for its beauty and transcendental sonic landscape. A contemporary of the well-loved English composers Herbert Howells and Ralph Vaughan Williams, Harris, in this short anthem captures both the transcendental and mystical aspects of the texts, aptly depicting the holiness and mystery of 'the tabernacle of God.'

The anthem, *Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether*, was written in 1945 by one of America's most influential church musicians of the 20th century, Harold Friedell, during his tenure as organist-choirmaster at New York's Calvary Episcopal Church. Written as a communion hymn for Pentecost Sunday, this anthem text is based off of a hymn composed by Percy Dearmer. The text beautifully links the singer with the disciples who gathered with Christ at the table. We are joined by a "tether"- an archaic word but an appropriate image of the work of the Holy Spirit that links Christians of every time and place at the table. In the final stanza, Dearmer makes a beautiful and powerful statement that "All our meals and all our living make as sacraments of thee." Through "caring, helping, giving, we may truly disciples be." Thus, the hymn begins in the upper room with the disciples and comes full circle as we join them around the table and are nourished to serve others in the world.
