Supporting Refugee Resettlement | The abrupt termination of federal financial support for refugee resettlement in January 2025 has led to chaos and hardship among newly arrived refugees. The Interfaith Refugee Family Support Initiative appealed to our congregations over the past several weeks to help bridge the financial gap left by the funding cutoff. We and those we serve are grateful for your generous donations. It will ease the lives of many newly arrived refugees.

<u>Seeking Leads on Employment Opportunities</u>: In the past two months volunteers from our Interfaith group and from Temple Micah have been supporting an Afghan Family of seven. We are helping this family with many thing, including q job search. Three of the adults, with minimal English skills, need jobs. The mother is a wonderful cook and has a college degree, working for an organization supporting women exposed to violence in Afghanistan for 10 years. The husband was a security guard, and the son has a high school degree, but no formal work experience. Please let us know if you have any contacts who might be able to provide employment opportunities for this family.

ICPC Book Discussion | The next Inter-Congregational Partnership Committee (ICPC) book discussion will be about *Letters to My Palestinian Neighbor,* by Yossi Klein Halevi.

The in-person discussion will be held Tuesday, May 13 in Covenant Hall from 7:00 – 8:30 pm, in-person only.

The author writes a series of letters to unspecified Palestinians to explain why Israel matters to him and the Jewish people, and why it's so hard to make peace even when folks want it. Mr. Halevi is upfront with his readers, sharing that he is representing his personal Jewish point of view but wishes to engage in a real dialogue. Originally published in 2018, the second edition (2019) includes responses from Palestinian and other Arab readers. Please read the second edition if possible.

- Those affected by hate, discrimination, and intolerance in at its forms as we stand in solidarity with our Jewish, Muslim and LBGTQ+ siblings.






