# RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

**RESPONSE IN FAITH** - PCUSA Confession of 1967

In each time and place there are particular problems and crises through which God calls the church to act. The church, guided by the Spirit, humbled by its own complicity and instructed by all attainable knowledge, seeks to discern the will of God and learn how to obey in these concrete situations.

God has created the peoples of the earth to be one universal family. In [God's] reconciling love, [God] overcomes the barriers between [people] and breaks down every form of discrimination based on racial or ethnic difference, real or imaginary.... Therefore, the church labors for the abolition of all racial discrimination and ministers to those injured by it. Congregations, individuals, or groups of Christians who exclude, dominate, or patronize [anyone], however subtly, resist the Spirit of God and bring contempt on the faith which they profess.

The kingdom represents the triumph of God over all that resists [God's]will and disrupts [God's] creation. Already God's reign is present as a ferment in the world, stirring hope...and preparing the world to receive its ultimate judgment and redemption.

With an urgency born of this hope, the church applies itself to present tasks and strives for a better world. In steadfast hope, the church looks beyond all partial achievement to the final triumph of God.

"Now to [God] who by the power at work within us is able to do far more abundantly than all we ask or think, to [God] be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

We will meet once a month (rather than weekly) to explore a new theme. Then we will have a month to engage with the theme and spiritual practices so that they might become part of our everyday living (they say it takes 21 days to form or break a habit).

A Note from Stewardship | At the close of the church's program year for Christian education, we salute and thank everyone who has volunteered this year as a Sunday School teacher for children, as a chaperone, teacher or mentor in the program for youth, or by sharing your expertise in Adult Education. A Music Note | It was in the late 1940's that the FBI began to investigate the Jewish American conductor, composer, and pianist Leonard Bernstein under suspicion of communism, anti-patriotic behavior and pacifistic tendencies. By 1971, when Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis commissioned Bernstein to write a work for the opening of the Kennedy Center, Bernstein had largely shrugged off the label of 'communist' (largely by naming names and formally, yet secretly, renouncing his communist views). Yet, his anti-war and anti-nuclear views were perhaps even more ingrained after two decades of war and the Cuban missile crisis. Hine mator is the final chorale in Bernstein's Chichester Psalms, which addressed many of the critical societal issues of the composer's time.
