
# **Upcoming Adult Education**

Please register in Realm so we know how many are coming. **ICPC Book Discussion** | The next Inter-Congregational Partnership Committee (ICPC) book discussion will be about *Letters to My Palestinian Neighbor*, by Yossi Klein Halevi.

The in-person discussion will be held Tuesday, May 13 in Covenant Hall from 7:00 – 8:30 pm, in-person only.

The author writes a series of letters to unspecified Palestinians to explain why Israel matters to him and the Jewish people, and why it's so hard to make peace even when folks want it. Mr. Halevi is upfront with his readers, sharing that he is representing his personal Jewish point of view but wishes to engage in a real dialogue. Originally published in 2018, the second edition (2019) includes responses from Palestinian and other Arab readers. Please read the second edition if possible.



A Music Note | The music of Sigfrid Karg-Elert (1877-1933) is becoming increasingly well known, though he's not yet a standard household name in this country. If an organ composer wanted to be recognized in Germany, they would write music based on chorales (i.e., German hymns). Such was the case of Karg-Elert when he composed his 66 Chorale Variations, Op. 65, of which Nun danket alle Gott is played this morning. He was influenced by the music of Bach, Claude Debussy, and Max Reger. Nun danket alle Gott represents these influences. Nun danket (Marche Triomphale) is perhaps his most famous composition for organ. Fragments of the tune (Now Thank We All Our God) are heard in the soprano voice, but in a disguised manner. Flourishes and chromaticism abounds, though within the strict parameters of tonality, hallmark traits for this romantic, impressionistic, and expressionistic composer.
