

We need teachers for the following classrooms:


Preschool Church School (ages 3-4) | 4 lead teachers to collaborate with parent volunteers (in a co-op style format) to teach a basic curriculum of story, craft and snack. Training in best practices for preschool classroom instruction and management will be provided and supervised throughout the school year by DCYFM Rosanna Howard.

Godly Play (Kindergarten) | 2 lead teachers and 2 door persons to teach the Godly Play curriculum and support the Godly Play classroom. Training in the Godly Play curriculum with a GP trainer and DCYFM will be provided.

Godly Play (1-2 Grade) | 2 lead teachers and 2 door persons to teach the Godly Play curriculum and support the Godly Play classroom. Training in the Godly Play curriculum with a GP trainer and DCYFM will be provided.

Club 3-4-5 | 3 lead teachers and 2 second adults to implement the Feasting on the Word Curriculum. Training in classroom management and best practices will be offered by the DCYFM.




Resource: *An Altar in the World* by Barbara Brown Taylor

Inter-Congregational Partnership Committee

The What | The Inter-Congregational Partnership Committee, ICPC, is a decades-old partnership originally between the Bethesda Jewish Congregation (BJC) and Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church (BHPC). In 2019, the Maqame Ibrahim Islamic Center (MIIC) joined the partnership when it began sharing sacred space at 6601 Bradley Blvd. in Bethesda, Maryland.



The Why | The ICPC works to nurture connections among the three faith communities throughout the year through shared service projects, social and topical events, an annual interfaith Thanksgiving service, and an annual interfaith spring picnic. We believe that engaging one another face-to-face, having conversations over food, learning about each other's experiences, and sharing our faith traditions helps us to see one another more fully and build enduring relationships.

UPCOMING ICPC EVENTS:

Introductions to Abrahamic Faith Traditions | Clergy of our congregations will conduct sessions for those interested in learning more about their own and the other traditions. Dr. Imad-ad-Deen Ahmad will present on Islam on 17 September; Rabbi Abbott will present on Judaism on 22 October; and Pastor David Gray will present on Christianity on 11 November. Each session is scheduled from 7:00 to 8:30 pm. We encourage you to attend in-person in the Library but a Zoom option will be available for those who cannot attend in person. We ask participants to register in advance. A separate notice with registration link is going out through our respective newsletters.

ICPC Book Event | October 28 at 7:00 pm in Covenant Hall. We will discuss *The Undocumented Americans* by Karla Cornejo Villavicencio, one of the first undocumented immigrants to graduate from Harvard University. The stories she tells are not deferential or naively inspirational but show the love, magic, heartbreak, resistance, insanity, and vulgarity that infuse the day-to-day lives of her subjects. All are welcome to attend.

Annual Thanksgiving Service and Brunch | November 16. The service is led jointly by the clergy of three faiths and a separate interfaith service is offered for all children. The offering is donated to a designated charitable organization, and a catered brunch with kosher and halal food follows the service. All are invited.

Annual Pulpit Exchange | BHPC clergy gives sermons on the bimah at a Friday night service at BJC and the rabbi speaks from BHPC's altar during a Sunday service. The most recent BHPC and BJC pulpit exchanges took place in August; we hope that you had the opportunity to attend.

Interfaith Picnic | Held in the spring, featuring kosher/halal food choices along with adult and children's activities.

Youth-Led Projects and Get-Togethers | To date, these activities have included informal basketball pick-up games, board game nights and story times for young children. More activities are planned including a more ambitious interfaith podcast project. Look for announcements in your newsletters.

Social and Social Action Activities | These include grounds cleaning and planting, food distribution programs, cooking meals together. More opportunities will be announced during the year.
