Adult Education | September

September 21 | Dr. R. Bruce Douglass (and close friend of Bradley Hills,) Director Emeritus, Reformed Institute of Metropolitan Washington and former Chair of the Department of Government at Georgetown University will be presenting a three part series:

REFORMED POLITICAL THOUGHT IN AN AGE OF CATASTROPHE (1914-1945)

Between 1914 and 1945, the West experienced a series of catastrophic political and economic developments. Not only did these developments call into question important parts of the beliefs that “advanced” thinkers had previously held, but they also confronted the societies in question with serious ethical challenges. It was a time when radical ideologies attracted wide followings, making it difficult for democratic regimes to govern. It was also a time when war took on a totalizing character that had devastating effects throughout much of the world. In addition, the global economy suffered a depression of unusual magnitude. During this period Reformed Protestants continued to play influential roles in public life, but they were forced to rethink a number of

the assumptions they had inherited from their 19th century predecessors. Under the leadership of such figures as Karl Barth, Emil Brunner, and the Niebuhr brothers, they found themselves returning to key parts of the Reformation heritage as they sought to bring their faith to bear on the multiple crises through which the world was living:

Session #3 – Depression

Dr. Douglass never fails to enlighten and remind us about how our faith has addressed the challenges of the past and the similarities and differences to those of today.

September 28 | Bradley Hills: The Church of the Future After celebrating Bradley Hills past 70 years, David Gray will engage us in a session that explores the possibilities and challenges for our future.

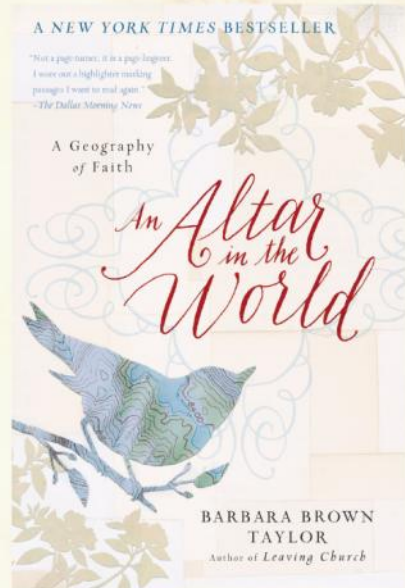

ICPC Book Discussion: Tuesday October 28 at 7:00 in Covenant Hall

The Undocumented Americans by Karla Cornejo Villavicencio

This is an opportunity to get to know members of BHPC, BJC, and MIIC better by reading and discussing a book about a timely subject. This book is written by one of the first undocumented immigrants to graduate from Harvard. Cornejo Villavicencio traveled across the country to capture the accounts of undocumented Americans who have been stereotyped, abused, and considered expendable. The stories she tells are not deferential or naively inspirational but show the full spectrum of emotions that infuse the day-to-day lives of her subjects. (The book was a National Book Award Finalist.)

A Music Note | This morning's musical offerings lift up a spectrum of musical traditions and voices. Composer William Bolcom composed several sets of Gospel Preludes inspired by the harmonic language of jazz and other Black musical traditions. His setting of this Victorian hymn tune is slow and harmonically piquant, expressing a sense of longing. The Summons was written by John Bell and Graham Maule, two musicians central to the ministry of the ecumenical Iona Community in Scotland. This evocative setting calls us into the heart of this tender, challenging text. Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel, the sister of Felix Mendelssohn, is often overlooked by history though she was actually a mentor and model for her younger brother. This vigorous, march-like piece shows her admiration for Bach's music.
