Being Part of Worship | As we enter the new program year, we would like to encourage community members to be a part of worship. **If you would like to read scripture or lead a call to worship some Sunday, contact Pastor David or Pastor Denise.**

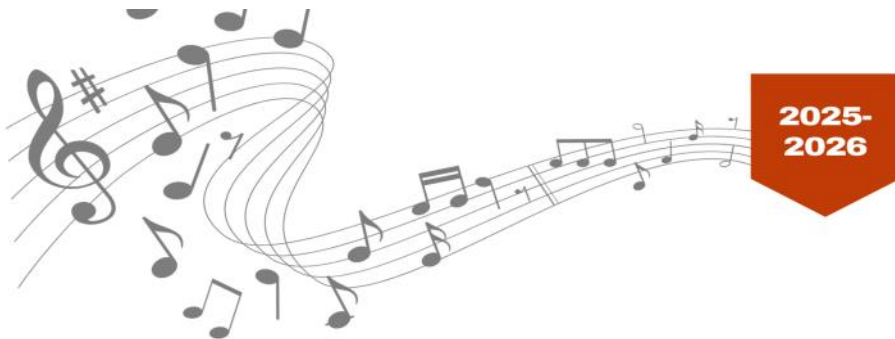


Director of Music Ministries Search | Nominating and Session have pulled together a group to begin work towards finding our long term Director of Music Ministries.

October 12 | 5pm

It is hard to overstate the power and brilliance of organist James O'Donnell's musicianship. Now Organist Emeritus at Westminster Abbey, O'Donnell led music at the Abbey for many state occasions over his 23-year tenure, including for the 2022 state funeral of Queen Elizabeth II. In 2023 O'Donnell was appointed Lieutenant of the Royal Victorian Order by King Charles III. O'Donnell now serves on the faculty of the Yale School of Music. Recent solo performances include at the BBC Proms, at the Royal Festival Hall in London, and with the London Philharmonic Orchestra.

Earlier this spring, the Racial Justice Coordinating Committee (RJCC) invited volunteers from our congregation to participate in drafting an Antiracism Policy, which our PC (USA) denomination requires every church to have. After receiving feedback from the BHPC Session, members of the BHPC RJCC met with several of the Lay Ministry groups to receive comments. Following the worship service on October 5, we are inviting the congregation to meet to discuss the draft policy and provide comments.

Dear Bradley Hills Friends,

Bradley Hills Presbyterian Church will collect our denomination's annual Peace and Global Witness special offering on October 5, 2025, however, the giving period will be open from September 16–October 13, 2025.



With this offering we come together to promote the peace of Christ by addressing systems of injustice in our own communities and around the world. Each year 25% of the funds collected is given to an organization chosen by Bradley Hills as a global witness of Christ's peace, and the other 75% is used by our denomination for ministries of peace, reconciliation, and justice in cultures of violence, including our own.

Al Ahli Arab Hospital (Ahli) in Gaza City, is operated by the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem and receives financial support from the American Friends of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem (AFEDJ). While Ahli primarily serves Palestinian Muslims and Christians, AFEDJ supports the humanitarian mission of Ahli hospital: "to offer healing and hope to every person in need, regardless of faith, politics, or ability to pay."

Through AFEDJ, BHPC's Mission Coordination Lay Ministry (MCLM) has supported Ahli for over 20 years in keeping its doors open to the most vulnerable in the region. Because of its longstanding relationship with Ahli, Bradley Hills has been very concerned about the hospital's survival since the outbreak of the Israel-Hamas war.

In a recent conversation with one of AFEDJ's directors, we confirmed that the hospital has suffered some structural damage but is open and continues to provide as many of the normal services as possible (including treating patients in serious condition and performing surgeries, sometimes without the benefit of anesthesia).

Our financial support will allow Ahli Hospital to continue serving the population of Gaza under the most brutal circumstances.
