Coming Home in the Fall

These past few weeks I've been thinking about home. I went back to Ohio to see my parents. We went to the Friday night football game at my high school. I was down on the field for a time with friends at the beginning. Being in the stadium and with my folks took me back. Then it was homecoming at our local high school here in Bethesda. With three at Whitman, Bridget and I had a chance to see homecoming weekend through the eyes of our kids. Then our oldest came home on fall break - the first time we've had a child come home from college. It was good having the whole crew together - at home.

There is something about fall that reminds me of going home. The leaves, flavors, weather, sports, remind me of home. Fall at home settled me growing up after travels and camps of the summer. The programming of the season at church brings me home. BHPC comes alive in new ways each fall.

November is a month that encourages us to think about home.

- November 2 is All Saints Sunday, when we honor those who have gone before us in faith. Those church members who have returned home to God.
- November 9 is Dedication Sunday, when we bring forth our pledges of support for 2026 to care for our church home at BHPC.
- November 16 is Interfaith Sunday, when we celebrate that 6601 Bradley is home to a unique model of spiritual siblings sharing sacred space.
- November 23 is Christ the King Sunday, when we finish the at church. liturgical year remembering that Jesus alone is our sovereign and we return to the one who prepares a place for us.
- November 30 is the First Sunday of Advent, when we come home in faith, and begin the new church spiritual year by focusing on the coming of the Christ into our world.

November is both an ending and a beginning. Both the end of one liturgical year and of one journey, and the beginning of new life to come. As we read in the Book of Revelation, which we often refer to in November, God is coming, to us, to bring us home.

This fall, around homecoming weekends, our Chancel Choir sang, both in worship and at a special memorial service, Stephen Paulus' haunting hymn, The Road Home. They beautifully sang,

> After wind, after rain When the dark is done As I wake from a dream In the gold of day Through the air there's a calling From far away There's a voice I can hear That will lead me home

Rise up, follow me Come away, is the call With the love in your heart As the only song There is no such beauty As where you belong Rise up, follow me I will lead you home.

Friends, with all the challenges of our time, the Holy Spirit calls to us. Inviting us to follow Jesus. The love of Christ's heart is here for each of us. For in faith, our Lord comes to lead us home.



We celebrate and appreciate the people from all generations who, over the past 70 years, have supported Bradley Hills through their pledges.


Dedication Sunday is a time where we bring our pledge cards forward during worship as a sacred act of love and commitment. This year Dedication Sunday will be on November 9.

Financial Lay Ministry | Third Quarter Update

Operating Budget

Thanks to the many members who have faithfully given, our revenue is tracking slightly ahead of budget. We experienced our typical summer giving slump and are grateful to everyone who has made the effort to "catch up." We continue to be mindful of potential economic uncertainties within our community. However, our current financial position continues to provide a solid foundation for the months ahead.

REVENUE

Overall: Ahead of budget:, 79.9% of year-to-date (YTD) budget achieved.

- Congregational Giving: Pledged giving at 79% and unpledged giving at 93% of annual budget
- Building Use: Congregational partners are on track.
- Investment/Other Income: Over 94.7% of annual budget, as we recorded the annual endowment draw income in January.

EXPENSES

Overall: Slightly ahead of budget:, 75.9% of (YTD) budget achieved.

Program Areas: Generally at budget (74%).

- **Property Management:** Ahead of budget (106%)due to higher than anticipated snow removal expenses and unanticipated BHPCNS classroom expenses.
- Mission (MCLM): Significant portion spent early in the year (97.1%), supporting 16 mission partners as well as summer youth trips.
- Session: Ahead of budget (95%). This is due to a payment made in support of our Racial Justice Program which exceeded what had been budgeted. This overage was reviewed and approved by the Finance Lay Ministry.

Operating Budget Bottom Line: YTD Net Income: \$70,342 (vs. budgeted year-end surplus of \$6,640).

Outlook: Well-positioned, but recognizing potential employment uncertainty within our community.

Capital Budget

Capital spending is at 79% of the annual capital budget and all projects are completed. A large portion of the money budgeted for window replacement was offset by grant funds received.


November 30th | Adult Ed will not meet over the Thanksgiving weekend. Join us for a Labyrinth walk outside between the two services.


