January 4 - Artificial Intelligence : Friend or Foe? Rob Gordon will help us explore the many roles that artificial intelligence plays now and promises to play the economy, defense, workforce, medicine, education, research, and our personal lives. Rob is the Senior Strategic Leader for AI and Digital Innovation at Document Storage Systems, a software product and integration company. He has extensive senior management and cross sector experience in the military, government, high tech, and non profit sectors. He served as Under Secretary of Defense for Military Community and Family Policy and received the Secretary of Defense Medal for Outstanding Public Service.

January 11 - What will humans be good for as Artificial Intelligence spreads through societies? Lee Rainie, Director of Elon University's, Imagining the Digital Future Center, returns to Bradley Hills to discuss the impact of AI on personal spirituality and dignity as well on work and jobs. Lee speaks frequently on national networks and cable. His center's research includes the influence of AI on human emotional connections. Lee joined the Imagining the Digital Future Center as director in 2023 after 24 years of directing Pew Research Center's efforts to study the internet and technology.

January 18 - Martin Luther King Weekend: Robert (Robby) P. Jones, the president and founder of Public Religion Research Institute (PRRI) returns to Bradley Hills. His visit two years ago provided direction to the work of our Racial Justice Coordinating Committee and the development of the Antiracism Policy, recently approved by the Session. Robby will update us on insights and recent data from PRRI's American Values Survey and ongoing analysis of public opinion in these challenging times. He is the author of the New York Times bestseller The Hidden Roots of White Supremacy and the Path to a Shared American Future (published September 5, 2023), as well as White Too Long: The Legacy of White Supremacy in American Christianity, which won a 2021 American Book Award. He's just finished writing a forthcoming book, Backslide: Reclaiming a Faith and a Nation After the Christian Turn Against Democracy, which will be published by St. Martin's Essentials next fall ahead of the midterm elections.

Suggested (though not required) audience preparation: learn how the 16th Annual Report of the PRRI uncovered surprising trends and attitudes about the current administration <https://contrarian.substack.com/p/most-americans-are-seeing-the-dangers>. Jones also writes a weekly newsletter for those dedicated to the work of truth-telling, repair, and healing from the legacy of white supremacy in American Christianity at www.whitetoolong.net.

January 25 – Artificial Intelligence and the Bible? Join us to examine how artificial intelligence can influence our understanding of the Bible. Dianne Whitaker and Clint Kelly return to the story of the Prodigal Son: Luke 15:11-32 and ask artificial intelligence to predict how the story plays out after a year has passed.
