## Upcoming Adult Education

**February 8** | Pastor Denise will preview this year's Lenten Small Groups, based on Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor's book *Learning to Walk in the Dark*.

Many of us remember may remember as children when the streetlights came on, that was the signal it was too dark to be outside and time to go home for the night. Today's children oftentimes require night-lights to keep monsters at bay while they sleep, and adults may need support in dealing with "dark" emotions. During the Christmas season, our hymns and scriptures focused on Jesus as the light of the world--"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it."

Using "cosmology, biology, and psychology...as well as history and theology" Rev. Taylor invites us to take a good look at darkness. The Lenten Small Groups we will accompany Rev. Taylor on "her journey to understand darkness... teaching us how to find God even in darkness and giving us a way to let darkness teach us what we need to know.

**February 15 and 22** | Denise Dombkowski Hopkins, Ph.D., Professor Emerita of Hebrew Bible, returns to Bradley Hills under popular demand to lead us in a dynamic study of ancient texts that speak to contemporary challenges.

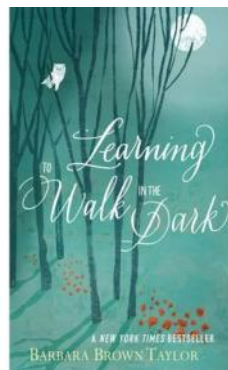
